










Mean NAPLEX Pass Rate for First-Time Attempts




FIRST-TIME PASS RATES ON NAPLEX, MPJE

MPJE PERFORMANCE: 3-YEAR TREND







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
DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAM

- **PhD Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences** was approved by THECB on July 25, 2019
- Inaugural cohort will be enrolled in **Spring 2020** at Kingsville and College Station under a '**one program, two campus**' model
- First of its kind model following **FDA Critical Path Initiative**
- Students will design and conduct research, have hands-on experience at research centers and laboratories, and complete a dissertation
