









Campus Specific Demographics


Average Cumulative GPA




Average Composite PCAT Score





Comparison with National and Cohort Data 2013 (School, n=21, National, n=3064, Cohort, n=197)
















AACP Graduating Students Survey





If I were starting my college career over again, I would choose to study pharmacy



I would recommend a career in pharmacy to a friend or relative








As I reflect on my pharmacy education, I would rate the overall quality of my education experience as very good
